

EUniWell Blended Intensive Programmes (BIP)

General information

Blended Intensive Programmes (or BIP) are study programmes supported by the Erasmus+ Programme developed and delivered jointly by at least three Higher Education Institutions. BIPs consist of groups of learners undertaking a short-term physical mobility abroad (between 5 and 30 days) combined with a mandatory virtual element, which aims to bring together online participants to work and learn collectively and simultaneously on specific tasks that are embedded in the BIP and count towards their overall learning outcomes. They are short, intensive programmes that use innovative ways of learning and teaching, including the use of online cooperation, as well as a real opportunity to develop international mobility skills.

Why is it important for EUniWell?

- Virtual campus: BIPs strengthen virtual international cooperation, connecting students and staff across partner institutions and fostering innovative ways of learning and teaching.
- Inclusion and accessibility: BIPs lower barriers for students who cannot commit to a full semester abroad, including those with fewer opportunities
- With its holistic approach to well-being and our proven excellent and complementary expertise in areas like health, climate change, urbanity, languages and civilisations, digital humanities, circular economy and sustainable practices, social equality, education, or artificial intelligence, EUniWell BIPs aim to further boost cutting-edge research and teaching related to well-being to sensibly impact on society and to position and establish itself as the world-leading European University for Well-Being. EUniWell's 5 thematic arenas are: health and well-being, social equality and well-being, environmental change, culture, multilingualism and teacher education (more information [here](#)).

How is mobility funded?

Erasmus+ funding comes from the EU budget and supports individuals (students, staff, academics) and organisations through lump sums and unit costs. The budget covers travel, living, and project costs for mobility and cooperation projects, managed via National Agencies or the Executive Agency, with specific grant amounts based on country groups and project types. For instance, an accommodation grant will be available for the stay abroad accordingly to the number of days of the course and a travel grant based on the distance from your home university to the host university including additional funds for Green Travel, if sustainable transportation is used.

Who is eligible to participate?

Participants attending the Blended Intensive Programme for learning or training can include:

- Higher education students enrolled in one of the partner universities; or.
- Higher education staff (academic and non-academic staff).

Learners from the country of the receiving Higher Education Institution (HEI) may participate in the Blended Intensive Programme, but do not count towards the number of reported participants, nor is any organisational support granted for these participants.

Inalco University

Eligible students (SMS): Bachelor's, Master's and PhD students enrolled full-time at Inalco are eligible for Erasmus+ mobility funding within the framework of a BIP. Final eligibility will be confirmed in consultation with the relevant department or programme coordinator prior to the nomination of candidates.

Eligible staff applying for a training mobility (STT), as learners: Applicants must apply through the EUniWell call. Final nomination will be decided internally by Inalco's Erasmus Office, subject to the availability of funds and mobility spots.

Eligible teaching staff (STA): Applicants wishing to teach in a BIP are required to apply through Inalco's annual call for staff mobility, which opens in May.

ECTS recognition: Recognition will be discussed internally with each department/track coordinator before nomination of candidates.
